A Zermatter of Fact

This issue is very proud to host an interview that has been a long time in the making. Not only are we very grateful that Martin Bell took the time out to speak to us, but also, as you will read, Martin has now spent more time in Zermatt skiing around than many of us and therefore qualifies perhaps more than most for the Zermatter title. For those of you who have been living on Mars for the last few years, Martin Bell achieved 6 top ten placings, more than any other British skier and came 8th at the '88 Olympics, again a record for British male downhill skiing.

Horn: When did you start skiing and get into ski racing?

Martin: On a family holiday in Scotland at the age of 6. I started racing 2 years later on a dry slope near Nottingham and won a race that was only 6 gates long! However the upshot of it was a scholarship to a training

Horn: So it all took off from there! What was your proudest moment?

Martin: It has to be ski related... and it's a tough one but I would have to say coming 8th in the 1988 Olympics. Since then I have always thought of 8 to be my lucky number...!

Horn: Presumably ski racing will always be part of your life, is it still part of your life now?

Martin: Well, living in Montana, I am helping to coach the local team and my daughter is doing very well having recently won 9 races out of the last 12. I keep up with all the FIS races of course even though I can't get to be there and there is a little twang knowing my brother is often there (Graham Bell), it's a real addiction following the circuit, but I do get to live in Montana, and that's a small price to pay.

Horn: You mention Graham, who has gone down the media route, is that something you wanted to do?

Martin: I did do some work for TV for a while, but I chose to be out of the loop when I moved to the US, although I am a little jealous, I am very pleased for him.

Horn: The perception is that British Ski Racing is very badly funded, did you find this when you were on the circuit?

out in '92 when the recession hit.

Horn: What do you get up to in the summer?

Martin: Well, actually I have been helping out a friend driving a bus for a rafting company, and helping another friend who is stonemason. That is very very hard work!!

Horn: What is the best advise you have ever had?

Martin: There was an ex racer in Aspen who was helping us out with some training and he told me: "When you start a turn in downhill, treat it like a woman and start gently".

Horn: Looking back on your career, would you have done anything differently with hindsight?

Martin: In Whistler 1986 I would have got my weight on my outside ski on Coaches Corner!

Horn: Ok, the standard questions: Tea or Coffee?

Martin: Coffee

Horn: Favourite Zermatt Run?

Martin: (after much discussion and furrowed brows) Momatt

Horn: Favourite pizza topping in the Wall?

Martin: Salami, peppers, olives and artichokes

Horn: chilli sauce?

Martin: Of course!

Horn: Favourite film?

Martin: Animal House

Horn: If you were an animal, what would you be?

Martin: A mountain goat. The only living creature that can get to the stashes before Chris Patient.

Horn: Best ski?

Martin: A 223cm Fischer downhill ski that I skied on around 1985-7.

Horn: So, why are you here working for Powder Byrne?

Martin: In 1997 the FT sponsored a team of bankers in a race called the Weisse Schuss in Flims. Arnie Wilson was the ski editor (now the editor of Ski and Board..) The MD of Powder Byrne was also there and I suggested the idea of running clinics so I did my first one here in Zermatt in 1998.

Horn: Wow, happy memories?

Martin: Well, in those days there was no Gant-Hohtälli cable car, just a t-bar instead called Blatte which got you up to Triftji, but once you were there....It was fantastic.
